

Admission criteria

The agreed criteria are:

- a bachelor's degree from a recognised university in a discipline relevant to humanitarian action
- academic record,
- academic potential,
- experience in the field of humanitarian action,
- work experience,
- having worked or studied abroad,
- motivation to take the programme, and
- knowledge of other languages.

Once admitted to the Master's programme, and together with the letter of admission, the student receives information about the registration process, which includes the deadline and timetable for registration.

They also receive information about the subjects on offer, teaching guides, timetables for face-to-face tutoring, available university spaces and resources, and the annual class calendar and the assessment periods.

In addition, you will be required to have a C1 level in the language(s) in which you take part of the programme. In cases where the student has difficulty in clearly accrediting the language level, he/she may have, this requirement will be verified by an interview carried out by representatives of the programme or by a telephone interview.
