

Master's Degree in Social Intervention Psychology ADMISSION CRITERIA

In addition to the entry requirements established in the current legislation, admission criteria include:

- 1. Receiving a favourable assessment for admission to the Master's programme. This assessment will take into account the following criteria:
- Academic record of the entry qualification (Bachelor's degree in Psychology), as well
 as previous postgraduate or continuing education studies related to the Master's
 degree (it has a weight of 45% in the assessment).
- Professional experience, internships in organisations and previous voluntary work (a weight of 15% in the assessment).
- Knowledge of other languages, especially English, above B2 (weighted at 10% in the assessment).
- Motivation to undertake the programme, professional aims, attitudes and values related to the professional career concerned, capacity for teamwork and personal maturity. (It has a weight of 30% in the assessment).
- 2. Ensuring that they have sufficient time and adequate financial resources to undertake the programme.

Two procedures will be used to issue a positive assessment for admission to the master's degree:

-Assessment of the documents submitted by candidates in support of their application:

- Application form
- Official academic transcript
- Full Curriculum Vitae with supporting documents
- Personal statement

-A personal interview where the following aspects will be assessed:

- Motivation for taking the Master's course
- Professional aims
- Attitudes and values in line with the professional activity for which the degree programme qualifies.
- Capacity for teamwork
- Personal maturity
