

What is the main added value of studying a Master's degree in the International Humanitarian Action field?

The Máster Universitario Erasmus Mundus en Acción Internacional Humanitaria – Erasmus Mundus Joint Master's Degree Programme in International Humanitarian Action (NOHA) has the added value of being a high-quality programme specifically designed for people who work or plan to work in the humanitarian action field in positions of responsibility in national and international organisations, both in office and field work.

Why NOHA?

The main objective of offering a Master's Degree in Humanitarian Action is to address the growing need for higher education qualifications that have been specifically designed to tackle complex humanitarian emergencies.

The NOHA Master's degree is the first global initiative to respond to the growing need for higher education qualifications specifically designed to address complex humanitarian emergencies. To this end, it was launched in 1993 as a result of the joint efforts of the NOHA network ([Network in Humanitarian Action / Red de Acción Humanitaria](#)) in close cooperation with two Directorates-General of the European Commission: the Directorate-General for Humanitarian Aid (ECHO) and the Directorate-General for Education and Culture. In September 2004, the European Commission selected the NOHA Master's degree as one of the first Master's Programmes of the Erasmus Mundus programme.

The Master's Degree in International Humanitarian Actions was ranked first in the Cooperation category of El Mundo's 2019/2020 Master's ranking.

The [NOHA Network](#) and the University of Deusto have signed a number of collaboration agreements with several institutions to support internships and research stays for students.
