Learning strategy

In the classroom: 40 h.

- Online instructions provided by the tutor
- Contextualized guidelines
- Hands on exercises in the classroom
- Interaction with information management tools
- Class discussion and grupal sharing and exchange of experiences

Outside the classroom

Evaluation of class assignments

Deadlines: Assignments submitted after the deadline will not count for the ordinary evaluation

Grading of exercises

- 5. Excellent: All elements submitted with outstanding quality and the student adds his/her own personal involvement.
- 4. Very good
- 3. Good: Almost all elements are fulfilled and the student adds his/her own personal involvement.
- 2. Fine: Most elements submitted, but without much personal involvement.
- 1. Fail: Not enough elements submitted, or a too short history log (eg. 3 or less editions) for each exercise.
- Competence weight
 - 70% Methodological tools (specific competence)
 - 20% <u>Concern for quality</u> (general competence)
 - 10% <u>Problem resolution</u> (general competence)

Plagiarism

Be aware that committing plagiarism means failing not only the assignment but the whole subject. There are two types of plagiarism:

- Reproducing other people's words without acknowledging the source. Don't forget to include references in all reproduced creative work.
- Copying the assignment from a classmate. If you collaborate with classmates in any class activity, make it explicit.
 Also it is very important that you follow your own process in the elaboration of the assignment and this must be evident from the history log of the assignment page.

Extraordinary evaluation

(for students who fail the ordinary evaluation)

- 40% Deadline extension a class assignment
- 60% Accumulated grades from class assignments within the ordinary evaluation
