2. THE PEDRO ARRUPE HUMAN RIGHTS INSTITUTE

The European Master's Degree in Human Rights and Democratisation (E.MA) is one of the educational and training programmes carried out by the **Pedro Arrupe Human Rights Institute.** The latter, which is part of the Faculty of Social and Human Sciences, was created in 1997. It aims to achieve one of the fundamental aspects of the ideal mission assigned to the University of Deusto: to contribute towards the edification and spreading of the culture of Human Rights in general, particularly in the Basque Country.

The work developed by the Human Rights Institute is built around three pillars or programmes of action:

- A) **Teaching**: it aims to spread knowledge on topics related to human rights, and to train agents and experts to be capable of intervening in favour of human rights with technical professionalism and competence. We currently offer a PhD programme, three international Master Courses and a non-official programme on human rights for indigenous leaders of Latin America.
- B) **Research**: Research is the Institute's core objective, which is carried out through the "Sociocultural challenges and Human Rights in a Changing World" research team. This programme has three officially recognised main research lines that have many conceptual and methodological synergies, depending on each project. Research lines include:
 - International protection and human rights
 - International migration and human rights
 - Human rights, cultural diversity and social cohesion
 - Research methods in human rights
- C) **Outreach and impact**: its aims is to spread a culture of assumption and respect for human rights throughout the Basque, Spanish and international societies, to denounce social injustice and the violation of rights, and to provoke serious and reflective social debate on political or social aspects from the perspective of human rights. The Institute carries out a wide range of activities aimed at disseminating knowledge, and has a number of

publications to increase awareness and commitment to promoting a Human Rights and building social awareness:

- Publications: Deusto Notebooks on Human Rights, Deusto Journal of Human Rights, Monographs, and other related publications.
- Outreach activities: such as conferences, seminars, workshops or congresses.
- Public impact: consulting for public institutions, collaboration with social organisations and entities, initiatives of direct political impact and hosting Human Rights defenders.

4. UNIVERSITY FACILITIES

I. LIBRARY

Opening Hours: 8:15a.m.-21:30 p.m. (Monday to Friday).

8:15 a.m.-14:45 p.m. (Saturday).

In 2009 the new **Library-CRAI** (Resource Centre for Learning and Research) of the University of Deusto opened. It is located in the other bank of the river, in front of the historical and centenary buildings of the University. This big glass cube is made up of ten floors with individual study rooms and group work areas, multimedia room, multipurpose rooms and a cafeteria.

The Central Library of the University of Deusto houses over 600,000 volumes, 5,213 periodicals and a variety of academic materials such as maps, microfilms, CD-ROMs, etc.

Don't forget your Student Card, you will need it to enter the Library building through the turnstiles of the Hall.

II. STUDY ROOMS

BOOKSHOP "CAMPUS"

PHOTOCOPYING SERVICE

Located in the car park outside the Main Building, behind the cafeteria. Students can order their photocopies or make them themselves using the photocopying machines at their disposal. The photocopying machines work with cards that can be purchased there.

Opening Hours: 8:30 a.m.-1:30 p.m./3:30 p.m.-7:00 p.m. (Monday to Friday).

CASH POINTS

There are cash dispensers (ATMs) of four banks (Banco Bilbao Vizcaya Argentaria, Caja Laboral, Banco Santander and Kutxabank) just at the bottom of the main staircase (in front of the cafeteria). There are two bank offices in the main building: Banco Santander and Kutxabank.

TRAVEL AGENCY

Carlson Wagonlit Travel Agency is located in the main building. It offers university students advice and special conditions for their holidays, class trips and stays abroad to learn foreign languages. It also organises holiday draws periodically.
